Mid-Week Lenten Services Continue @ 12 noon & 6:30 pm

Mid-week Lenten services continue at 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. each week. We use the Holden Evening Prayer for worship and we hear from the "Silent Witnesses."

There were many witnesses to the suffering of Christ and his crucifixion that took place over 2,000 years ago on a hill outside of Jerusalem. There were angry crowds, those who loved Jesus, and those that were required to be there tending to the necessary tasks which went along with an execution. But there were other witnesses as well, witnesses we don't usually think about, although they were even closer to the events than the crowd. Memorable objects involved in our Lord's suffering and death; the thorn, robe, nail, spear, shroud and stone which guarded the tomb, all took part in the events surrounding Christ's crucifixion. On Wednesday nights during Lent, these "silent witnesses" come to life and share their viewpoints and deepen our understanding of the Passion story.

Holy Week and Easter

April 2 is Palm Sunday and the start of Holy Week.

Worship at 5 p.m., 8, 9 and 11 a.m. We start the week with a palm procession as we are reminded of Jesus' procession into Jerusalem, as he entered into the city with Alleluias. We will also hear the whole Passion story.

April 6 is Maundy Thursday.

Worship at 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. We hear the command to love one another as Christ has loved us and we partake in the Lord's Supper. As Jesus left the meal and went to the Mt. of Olives, it was there he was betrayed and arrested.

April 7 is Good Friday.

Traditional worship at 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. We hear the seven last words of Christ. Family service at 5:30 p.m.

April 8 & 9 is the Celebration of Easter.

Saturday worship at 5 p.m. and Sunday worship at 8, 9:30 and 11 a.m.

We proclaim together *Christ is Risen, He is Risen Indeed!*



financial update

Mortgage Reduction Progress

We are very pleased to report that with your ongoing gifts to the Building Fund, your special gifts to the mortgage reduction effort, and the Zion Foundation's matching grant for mortgage reduction, we have reduced our mortgage significantly in 2022. As of February 15, 2023 our mortgage balance has been reduced by approximately \$550,000 (see below). Reducing our mortgage is saving a significant amount of interest over the remaining life of our loan and will allow us to pay our loan off about 3 years early. There is still about \$100,000 available over the next two years for matching special gifts given for mortgage reduction. Any new gift, over and above current pledges in place for our capital appeal, will be matched dollar for dollar by the Zion Foundation. "Mortgage Reduction" envelopes are available at the front desk. The chart below shows the reduction in our mortgage loan balance since January 2022. Thank you for your continuing support of the Building Fund and our mortgage reduction effort!

^{*}This includes a transfer of \$25,115 from ERC funds (ERC is Employee Retention Credit) to cover a small shortfall of \$25,115. The deficit was the result of an increase in utilities, insurance and snow removal.

Following Jesus to the Cross

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, the season of Lent offers believers an opportunity to ponder Christ's journey to the cross and his crucifixion. It marks a time to reflect on the love of God witnessed by the death of his Son, Jesus Christ on the cross to defeat sin and death. Most importantly, it provides 40 days for contemplation, prayer and preparation for the good news of Christ's resurrection and the promise of eternal life that Easter brings.

T-Throne Hebrews 12:2 "...fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the **throne** of God."

Please join us for mid-week Lenten worship beginning on Wednesday, March 1 as we hear from the "silent witnesses" of the crucifixion – the thorn, robe, nail, spear, shroud, and stone. Services will be held at Zion at noon and 6:30 p.m.

Family Promise News

We are thrilled to announce the purchase of two adjoining properties to open a Family Promise Campus this spring! The Family Promise Campus enables us to better serve families and children in Anoka County through a continuum of services for families experiencing homelessness and housing insecurity. The Family Service Center (formerly called the Day Center) will be located at 363 Coon Rapids Boulevard in Coon Rapids and the residential property where shelter space will exist is at 340 95th Avenue NW. We will be more centrally located within the county and right on a public transit bus line, increasing accessibility for families without their own transportation. Watch for more information regarding Zion's volunteer involvement as we move full-speed ahead on the fundraising efforts to make sure we have what we need to bring the project to completion. We are looking for a few people to help us with sub committees looking to raise the first \$130,000 toward the project. We've broken that goal down into different categories, including congregations, individuals, and service organizations. Each of these areas will have a short-term committee helping to raise the funds and shepherd the process to ensure we get the support needed to get the new Family Service Center up and running.
