### message from pastor brent



Family Promise in Anoka County has provided shelter and support services for families experiencing homelessness for more than 10 years. Zion partners with Family Promise to serve families in need of emergency shelter and served as a shelter site when Family Promise followed a congregational rotation model to provide shelter space—until the pandemic. Family Promise received a Community Development Block Grant from Anoka County of \$1.2 million dollars to purchase two adjacent

parcels of land in Coon Rapids for the new Family Promise campus. The campus will include offices, a day center for the families, and eventually a multi-unit micro apartment building(s) for the shelter program for families. The new Family Promise campus is located in Coon Rapids, just off of Coon Rapids Boulevard and Highway 610. It is centrally located within the county and on a public transit bus line. It will be the first family shelter of its kind in Anoka County.

Family Promise will need the financial support of congregations and individuals to pay for renovations to the day center and office building and for the cost of planning for the new apartment building/permanent shelter for families. #### In the Spirit of Mercy

According to dictionary.com, mercy is compassionate or kindly forbearance shown toward an offender, an enemy, or other person in one's power; compassion, pity, or benevolence. Prior to the advanced technology of car cameras, a woman was backing out of a parking spot when she noticed a sedan in her rearview mirror doing the same. She stopped but the other driver didn't, causing him to graze her bumper. They both exited their cars to assess the damage. His bumper reminded her of urban graffiti; making it difficult to tell if the fender bender added to the existing collage of dents and scrapes. As for her nearly flawless bumper, there appeared to be a fresh scratch or two. The driver apologized and begged her to let it go, saying he couldn't afford a rate hike with his insurance. Reacting to the distress in his voice, the woman agreed to walk away, even though the scratches were caused by him. By doing so she showed him an abundance of mercy. Another example of mercy, as God intended, occurred during the height of COVID-19. A police officer responding to a call about a shoplifter at a small grocery store, came face-to-face with a mom accused of stealing a loaf of bread. Instead of arresting her or dismissing her with a warning, he bought groceries for her family and sent her on her way. According to Psalm 145:8, "The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love." There are numerous examples in the Bible of God's gracious mercy, any number of which we can choose to emulate. In the Old Testament, King Manasseh was a wicked king. God's punishment was to imprison him at which time the king humbled himself and implored God through prayer. With a merciful heart, God forgave him and restored him as king. In the New Testament, Simon Peter denied knowing Christ three times and yet was very influential in the early church. For more examples of mercy, follow the ministry of Jesus in the Gospels and you won't be disappointed.

#### Pentecost Weekend - May 27-28

Pentecost derives its name from the Jewish festival celebrating the harvest and the giving of the law on Mount Sinai fifty days after Passover. Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the Holy Spirit as God's presence within and among us. In Acts, the Spirit arrives in rushing wind and flame, bringing God's presence to all people. Paul reminds us that though we each have different capacities, we are unified in the Spirit that equips us with these gifts. Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit on his disciples, empowering them to forgive sin. We celebrate that we, too, are given the breath of the Holy Spirit and sent out to proclaim God's redeeming love to all the world. Wear **RED** as we celebrate the Holy Spirit!

#### A Message from Zion's Nursery

While we encourage and celebrate families bringing their children to worship, we understand that this is not ideal for every family all of the time. For those seeking professional child care during worship, we offer nursery care from 9 a.m. - 12 p.m., mere steps away from the Sanctuary.

Staffed by background-checked employees (one of whom will always be an adult with current CPR and First Aid certifications), the nursery provides a warm, enriching, Christ-centered environment for children ages six weeks through three years.

Our Child Care Coordinator (affectionately known by many families at Zion as "Miss Samantha") has been faithfully working in our nursery since 2009. Along with years of experience and training in numerous child safety measures, she is currently pursuing a degree in Child Development. Feel free to stop by and say hello. Parents and caregivers are always welcome to join their child in the nursery.

#### Habitat for Humanity 2023

There are a number of ways to volunteer with Twin Cities Habitat For Humanity. For many years, Zion volunteers have helped to build a new home or to rehab an old home which Habitat would sell with an affordable mortgage to a qualified buyer. A less well-known arm of Twin Cities Habitat is a program called "A Brush With Kindness". Here the goal is to help a homeowner do repairs that will allow them to stay in their house and get needed help with repairs. In most cases, the family will be living in the house as volunteers come in to do repairs. Repairs are most frequently done to the exterior of the home.

This year, Habitat has asked Zion volunteers to help with this ABWK program. We will be helping on a house in Brooklyn Park from July 11-14, so this will be a 4 day week instead of 5 as we have done in previous years. The scope of work involves repair of damaged siding and trim, as well as painting the exterior of the house. Left unattended, damage such as this can lead to rapid deterioration of the house.

The goals of Twin Cities Habitat "Build Forward Together" program are to expand homeownership opportunities, advance racial equity and engage the community to strengthen our foundation.
