Cheap Grace

Lutheran Theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer states, "Cheap grace is the idea that "grace" did it all for me so I do not need to change my lifestyle. The believer who accepts the idea of "cheap grace" thinks he can continue to live like the rest of the world. Instead of following Christ in a radical way, the Christian lost in cheap grace thinks he can simply enjoy the consolations of his grace." Rather convicting, wouldn't you agree? One of the challenges for Christians is to navigate living **in** this world while not living **of** this world. Here you have two very small words with immense implications. God, our Creator intended for us to be born in harmony with our surroundings and in perfect relationship with him. But Adam and Eve's disobedience resulted in a broken world. This is the same world we live in today, no choice on our part. But what hasn't changed is, like Adam and Eve, we are wired to be in relationship with God. It is our choice to live in Christ, meaning our day-to-day thoughts and actions are not to be **of** this world. However, there are endless temptations serving as obstacles to this end; even though we try to follow Christ, we falter. But here's the good news—God's grace is a gift which is new each day, a gift which ought never to be taken lightly. The Lord's grace and discipleship is inseparable according to Apostle Peter. The Son of God...Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of his name among all the nations, including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ. Romans 1:4-6. This is where cheap grace ends and living a full life in Christ begins. In the Confessions of St. Augustine we read, "You have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless till they find their rest in you." I love that! It is in response to God's grace that we 'let our light shine' at Zion and in the greater community.

Upcoming Adult Forums

Adult Forums are held Sunday mornings at 10 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Below is the upcoming schedule:

- October 1 *Exodus Lending*: Exodus Lending is the only nonprofit dedicated solely to helping Minnesotans get out of predatory lending debt and back on track financially by enrolling and supporting them in a 0% interest refinance program, lending up to \$1,500 to qualified participants. Join Executive Director Anne Leland Clark and board member Kim Miller as we learn more about this important ministry.
- October 8 Stewardship Breakfast
- October 15 How To Talk To Your Aging Parent About Money: Money tends to be a sensitive topic that most people avoid discussing. Generally, it's the polite and uncontroversial thing to do. But when it comes to adult children and aging parents, this is a conversation that simply has to happen. Failing to talk about legal and financial matters with Mom and Dad could put you in a very difficult position should you ever need to help them manage their money or take over these decisions entirely. Part one of our forums on Helping Aging Parents sponsored by Rachel Circle, we will discuss motivations for asking questions about your parents' financial situation and how parents can bring this up with their children.
- October 22 Family Dynamics As We Age: What happens to people as they age and their children grow up? Most of them say, "I want to stay in my own home until I die." The current reality is that "despite the pandemic, the percentage of older adults who want to age in place has stayed steady." In this second session from the Rachel Circle, we will discuss how there is a rapid growth in published knowledge about different aspects of age and aging. While this is highly welcome, it becomes increasingly difficult to keep up even with the main insights. We will talk about the research findings that demonstrate both the challenges and opportunities lying ahead of us as life expectancy is increasing steadily and as the proportion of older people in our societies will grow further.
- October 29 *The Reformation in Architecture and Music* presented by Dr. Jonathan Campbell: How the Renaissance and Baroque Catholic architecture and music influenced the Reformers and shaped the churches we know today. Dr. Campbell will also include slides from his recent trip to Italy.

From Zion Addiction Recovery Team

The newly formed Zion Addiction Recovery Team seeks to "offer a safe place of hope, support, and advocacy for those seeking recovery so that we can build resilience and thrive in our lives and communities." The work before us is to help create an appropriate and sustainable response to the crisis of addiction in our local community. A meeting for those in the Zion community interested in joining the team was held on September 26. They heard about work accomplished by the team and answers to their questions about what involvement would look like if they joined. The team is grateful for the interest shown and for all who attended.

Several team members participated in a webinar offered by the Center of Addiction and Faith (CAF) and learned about how to create a "recovery-friendly church". Topics included building congregational support, equipping the leadership, and developing the team and ministry. Clergy and others discussed their experiences creating a recovery-friendly church.

Representatives from our Recovery Team will be attending the annual conference of the Center for Addiction and Faith on October 5-7 in Bloomington, MN. We look forward to sharing what we will learn. For more information about this conference go to http://www.addictionandfaithconference.com/.

From Zion Rachel Circle - Domestic Violence Awareness Month

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM). Nationally, we "honor the tremendous dedication of advocates and service providers, the courage and resilience of survivors, and recommit to standing with them for safety, dignity, and justice." In Anoka County and around Minnesota, DVAM is observed through proclamations by city councils, displays of purple lights at night, grass roots advocacy groups, faith communities and individual citizens offering community educational programs, book groups focusing on domestic violence issues, and events hosted by domestic violence shelters (Alexandra House and The Dwelling Place).

In 2013, a ministry was formed at Zion, the Rachel Circle, to focus on domestic violence issues—through education and community involvement. Each October at Zion, you will see the effort to raise awareness through:

- Visual symbols—purple candles, purple flowers, the cross above church and front entrance
- Spiritual practices—prayers, hymns, stories and sermon texts
- Education—displays in the lower commons with things to read and do, forums on Sunday morning

This year, Rachel Circle is hosting two Sunday morning forums during October focused on <u>Elder Abuse Awareness</u> and <u>Prevention</u>. Adult children, older parents and single older people - this is for you. Learn things that can benefit your family greatly and have the potential to prevent family conflict in the later stages of life.

- October 15: "How To Talk To Your Aging Parents About Money"
- October 22: "Family Dynamics As We Age"
