a farewell message from pastor brent



As most of you know by now, I will be retiring at the end of this month, after 37 years in parish ministry and more than 8 ½ years as your Lead Pastor. As I prepare to say good-bye, I think of a weekly experience that I had during the pandemic. During that time, many of us gathered in the main parking lot every Sunday and worshipped together “drive-in” style. The drive-in experience was, for me, and for many of you, a powerful experience in the midst of a difficult time. It was so good to be able to gather together—even if it was in a parking lot! At the conclusion of the “drive-in” service, the pastors developed a familiar ritual. We would wait at the driveways and wave at each of you as you left the parking lot in your cars and you would wave and smile back. At the beginning of the pandemic it was kind of an emotional moment—because we did not know how long this “separation” would last. We looked forward to seeing you again the next week. In a few cases, it was the last time that we saw a beloved sister or brother in Christ. Yet, we remembered that farewell in the parking lot and we knew that one day we would meet again in the Church Triumphant.

That is the same sentiment that I am experiencing as I prepare to retire in a few weeks. I hope to see you again as we go about our daily lives, and if our paths do not cross again, I trust that we will see each other again on the other side. As I say “good-bye”, there are a few things that I want to leave you with.

First, thank you for the privilege of being your Lead Pastor at Zion. It has been such a joy to share worship with you, to share life’s joys and sorrows, to celebrate Christmases and Easters, our 150th Anniversary, and so many other special times with you. Thank you for your generosity and kindness. Thank you for serving and sharing your gifts in so many ways. Special thanks to all those who have served in leadership, and thank you to Zion’s wonderful staff—you are a great team!

Second, please continue to pray for, support and encourage Pastor Connie, Pastor Sue, all the Church staff, and our congregation’s leaders. Please continue to be the faithful, supportive disciples that I’ve come to know. As Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 13:11-12, “Dear brothers and sisters, be joyful. Grow to maturity. Encourage each other. Live in harmony and peace.” This is my prayer for you, my Zion brothers and sisters.

As I stood at the edge of the driveway of our church parking lot during the days of “drive-in” worship, I trusted that one way or the other, I would see each one of you again someday. As that great hymn says so well: “God be with you till we meet again; holy wings securely hide you, daily manna still provide you; God be with you till we meet again. Till we meet, till we meet, till we meet at Jesus’ feet; till we meet, till we meet, God be with you till we meet again.”

lead pastor transition update



Dear Zion Friends in Christ,

The Church Council met yesterday to discuss next steps of the transition process for when Pastor Brent retires on February 29th. What follows is an update to the previous communication.

First, a celebration lunch for Pastor Brent and his 37 years of ministry will be held on Sunday, February 25th at 12:00 noon. More details to come but save the date as we honor Pastor Brent and wish him all the best on his well-deserved retirement!

Second, to meet our pastoral needs during the transition of leadership, the Church Council unanimously voted to name Pastor Connie Interim Lead Pastor effective March 1. Pastor Connie has worked through many transitional periods while at Zion, has a great working relationship with our church staff, and her years of ministry at Zion brings continuity to our church community during this time of change. Please keep Pastor Connie and the entire staff in your prayers during this time of transition.

Third, the Minneapolis Area Synod is working with us to find an Interim Associate Pastor to take on some of Pastor Connie's current duties. We are hopeful to have a few candidates to consider soon. More to come on this in future communications.

Lastly, with a plan in place for interim pastoral coverage, the Church Council will begin to focus on assembling a Call Committee. In accordance with our church bylaws. "When a pastoral vacancy occurs, a Call Committee of six voting members shall be elected by the Congregational Council (B13.01, b5). The goal of the Executive Committee and Council is to appoint a Lead Pastor Call Committee at the next Council meeting in February.

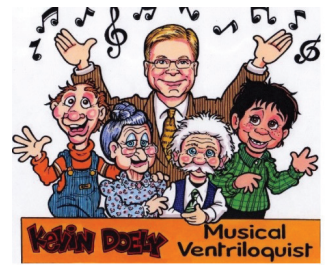

a personal reflection

Truth at the Well

Like an onion, Bible stories are often comprised of many layers before one gets to the core of the message. The Woman at the Well is one such story. Having sent his disciples on an errand, Jesus arrives alone at Jacob's well, tired and thirsty from his journey. When a Samaritan woman comes to draw water from the well, he asks her for a drink. This sounds like such a simple request yet there is nothing simple about it. If she had given him a drink and he subsequently went on his way, this story would have been edited from the book of John. Let's peel away some layers to gain a closer look. By asking this woman for a drink, he ignored the hostility between the Samaritans and the Jews. The woman recognizes the absurdity of the situation and calls him on it, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan. How can you ask me for a drink?" Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." John 4:9-10. Jesus then explains what 'living water' means by revealing himself to her. He makes himself credible in her eyes by describing details of her life that he oughtn't have knowledge of. In this way, Jesus was making a disciple out of her, knowing she would turn to her people proclaiming him as the Messiah. Of course, this is exactly what she does and because of her testimony, the Samaritans invited Jesus to stay two more days and many more became believers. Throughout Jesus' ministry, his actions were often counter to the culture he lived and preached in. This story is no exception. Jesus had a long and meaningful conversation with a woman when women, at that time, were often denigrated and dismissed. It was his intention to draw all people to him, no matter their religion, social status, gender, age, vocation or physical and mental well-being. As for today, Jesus' ministry and relationships serve as an example for us to mimic on our life's journey.

Recovery Team

Zion is beginning a new Addiction Recovery Ministry, and the Addiction Recovery Team needs your help. Much is made in the disciplines of spiritual growth about the difference between “talking the talk” and “walking the walk.” In the final analysis, of course, it is the “walk” that counts. Yet we can’t ignore the importance of the “talk” either. Knowing how people think or feel not only helps one understand how they act, it also gives clues on why they might act differently than they think or feel. The Addiction Recovery Team wants to hear your “talk” by asking you to complete a short online survey. This survey, provided by Faith Partners and compiled by the University of Texas for our use, will be available online February 4-18 (see link below) and will help provide future direction of this ministry. If you are unable to use the link, we will have paper copies available.

Please join the Zion Addiction Recovery Team during the Sunday Adult Faith Forum on February 11 as we explain more of the details and introduce you to our team.
